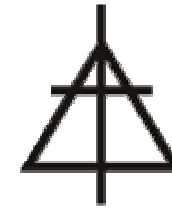

Community Opportunities Scan Last Monday evening, as a congregation, we enjoyed a wonderful presentation by Tammy Heidbuurdt as she gave a background of what the Community Opportunities Scan is all about, namely sharing Jesus' love with the community through acts of service. She adequately outlined the key components of the COS process (ie building a team, the importance of undergirding the whole process in prayer, defining the community, gathering information through interviewing a cross section of the community, including business leaders, police, service institutions, town council, ministerial, and others, and then once specific opportunities have been identified to involve the gifts of the broader congregation to be Christ's hands and feet in seeking to address these opportunities in our community.

Tammy shared many stories of other churches who have gone through the COS process and the various community opportunities (projects) that these churches have been privileged to be a part of as a result. One of the most positive outcomes for these churches who have initiated the COS process, is a greater sense of personal ownership and desire to live out the "world and life view," that God has placed us in this community to not only meet the needs of those within the church but to also extend his lordship and love over the entire community by reaching out in concrete ways, sharing Christ's love, serving him by meeting the needs of others around us.

One could not help but be positively impacted by Tammy's enthusiastic and bubbly presentation. Thank you to Tammy and thank you to our local COS committee for this informative meeting. (Members are Gerald Schipper, (chair), Shirley Schuurman, Gordon Wells, Sharon Schipper and Tony Haayema (deacon/council rep). Our local committee is now at the point of bringing together a list of questions for the community interviews. Once this list of questions has been finalized, the interview process will begin and from the information gleaned, community opportunities will be determined to present to the congregation at a later date.
